



West Shore Pipe Line Company Announces Binding Open Season for Granville to Green Bay Pipeline Project

LEMONT, IL, January 27, 2017 – West Shore Pipe Line Company (“West Shore”) announced today the launch of a binding open season to solicit commitments related to transportation service from origin points in Romeoville, Illinois, Hammond, Indiana, and Granville, Wisconsin to destination points in Green Bay and Fox River, Wisconsin (the “Project”). The Project contemplates the construction of new piping extending from Granville, Wisconsin to Green Bay/Fox River, Wisconsin. The open season commenced at 8:00 a.m. Central Standard Time on January 27, 2017 and is scheduled to conclude at 5:00 p.m. Central Standard Time on March 15, 2017, although such date may be extended by West Shore.

The open season process provides potential shippers with the opportunity to make volume commitments to the Project and execute long-term transportation contracts with West Shore. Shippers electing to do so will receive discounted transportation rates for the transportation of their committed volumes on the Project. For more information about the open season, interested shippers will be required to sign and return a copy of the necessary confidentiality agreement.
